Park update during COVID-19

On March 17, 2020, the Province declared a state of emergency which continues to be in effect.

THE PARK IS CLOSED TO THE GENERAL PUBLIC although effective June, 19, 2020, York Region moves into Phase 2.

Campers must continue to maintain two-metre physical distancing with people outside their household and when outside of their campsites and to adhere to social gathering size restrictions up to 10 persons.

The park office will remain closed in Phase 2. Public common areas such as the clubhouse, playground and games area remain off-limits but the trails and common green space areas are open for use.

- The Emergency Order has extended the deadline by which Ontario Not-for-profit Corporations must hold an AGM to 120 days after the current State of Emergency is lifted.
- The Park is exploring ways of holding a **virtual** Members' Meeting this summer - please stay tuned to the corporation website.
- Pool Opening - York Region Department of Health has confirmed that we may open our pool with restrictions in place.
- Septic Bed - Approvals from the Ministry of the Environment are delayed due to COVID-19.

The membership is reminded to implement the additional rules listed below to ensure that everyone remains healthy and safe.

- Please keep a 2-metre distance, at a minimum. If that cannot be maintained a mask/face covering is recommended.
- If you are experiencing any of the symptoms of COVID-19, do not come to the Park and if you are unsure what the symptoms are please complete the self-assessment at <https://covid-19.ontario.ca/self-assessment/>.
- If you are currently off work for a 14-day isolation/quarantine period do not come to the Park!
- When you come to the Park go straight to your trailer site. Gatherings in common areas or on the roads are not permitted at this time.
- The park is closed to the general public.
- Vendor attendance is by appointment and should be booked via the Park email address.
- Gatherings of more than 10 people are prohibited.

Georgina Township updates during COVID-19

Resident parking pass: 2019 resident parking passes are valid for 2020. If you require a new one, call customer service at 905-476-4301 to request a parking pass form and it will be mailed to you to fill out and may be placed in the drop box at the Civic Centre. The online form can be found at georgina.ca/ParkingPass

Trails: Town trails are open with the following guidelines: practise physical distancing of at least two metres, leash and pick up after your dog, and take your litter home with you. To learn more, visit georgina.ca/trails.

Canada Day: Get ready for our first ever [virtual Canada Day celebration](#). Our annual Canada Day event will be online this year on July 1. This will allow residents to mark this popular event safely from the comfort of their homes. Planning for the virtual Canada Day event is well underway. More information will follow about activities and entertainment

Boat launches: Town boat launches are open. This includes Young's Harbour, Adeline Park, Rayners Park, King Road End, Holmes Point Road across from Peninsula Resort and 101 Clovelly Cove. Anyone launching a boat is asked to maintain physical distancing by staying two metres apart. Parking is limited and available on a first-come basis.

Some parks now open: All parks, excluding waterfront parks and beaches, are now open for public use while adhering to physical distancing guidelines. Playground equipment, volleyball courts, skateboard parks and splash pads remain closed as do all washroom facilities. Beginning June 12, the province will increase the limit on social gatherings to 10 people.
